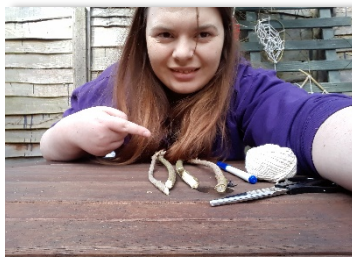
Finding your inside wildside

For this post I am inspired by my colleague Rod's recent blog about the Romans. The Romans have made their mark on the Trent Valley Landscape leaving behind remnants of their roads.

So I thought it would be fun to make a Stick Roman!



Useful tip:
Wrap the string/wool round like an ∞ , going round each branch securing them tightly.

What you will need:

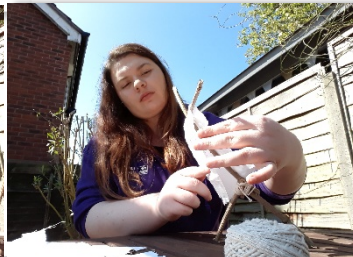
- 4+ Sticks
- Wool or String
- Scissors
- Small amount of fabric

1. Put the stick(s) for arms across the stick for body making a cross. Tie together with string or wool.

2. Put the sticks for legs at end of body and tie round with string/wool.



3. Cut a length of fabric, in the middle cut out a circle to go over your stickman's head.



5. Place tunic over stickman and tie a length of string around the middle. You can cut little holes in the sides as belt loops.



Add a little grass crown (optional)
Tada! Stick Roman!
