What makes it tricky is that there are slight differences between rabbits and hares:

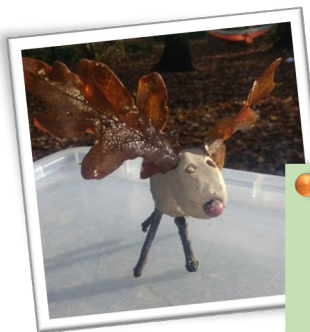
- Size
