Funding

- Existing projects/could do for free – create wildflower meadow
- Big grant pot – could create a memorial garden.
- Smaller pots are easier to apply for and generally quicker decisions
- Partnership project – want to engage with Wildlife Trust, RSPB
- Larger members of Green Network can partner with smaller organisations for large projects
- Biodiversity Net Gain – would like to find someone to support with this funding
- Need to fit the criteria, tweak ideas to funding application

Challenges:

- There are few funds for admin staff/project management, many funds only want to pay for capital work.
- Time it takes for writing big applications is hard on volunteers
- Big pots of funding are difficult for smaller orgs to apply for/manage

Green Network ideas

- People/groups come and present good practise and projects
- Focus on 1 topic at a time
- Co-ordination between SBEN and communities and councils (eg carbon trackers)
- Training for communities to learn retrofit qualifications
- Info about recycling and access to tech
- Emails – short and topical
- List of members with websites
- Willingness for collaboration and joint funding
- Want to know how to engage with local landowners – Friends of Bilbrook have run out of room for new projects on land. TTV have good examples of this.
- Wider links – eg NHS/social housing (own large amounts of land)
- Use existing networks and mailing lists eg Friends of Bilbrook
- Green Network steering group to use contacts to reach senior staff and decision makers
- Encourage Internal communication within organisations to embed sustainability
- NHS voice is missing – there are strong links to health and wellbeing. Green Network to strengthen existing links to health work via Support Staffordshire
- Networking can't just be online – still need paper copies of information eg Bilbrook Buzz

- Need to engage with groups who are not already involved or have an interest
- How to make people feel welcome
- School networks for information sharing
- Language – how can we pitch to people – link to co-benefits to people (not climate)
- Training – around planning regs and law eg RoWs
